WHAT DOES MERRIMACK COUNTY SAVINGS BANK (The Merrimack), MEREDITH VILLAGE SAVINGS BANK (MVSB), SAVINGS BANK OF WALPOLE (SBW) and THE NEW HAMPSHIRE TRUST COMPANY (NHTrust) DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?

Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Social Security number and income ■ Account transactions and transaction history and account balances ■ Overdraft History
How?	All financial companies need to share customers' personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers' personal information; the reasons The Merrimack, MVSB, SBW and NHTrust choose to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

Who we are

Who is providing this notice?

Merrimack County Savings Bank, Meredith Village Savings Bank, Savings Bank of Walpole and The New Hampshire Trust Company.

What we do

How do The Merrimack, MVSb, SBW and NHTrust protect my personal information?

To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings.

Employee access to your information is restricted to those who have a business reason to know such information.

How do The Merrimack, MVSb, SBW and NHTrust collect my personal information?

We collect your personal information, for example, when you

- open an account
- pay your bills or apply for a loan
- make deposits or withdrawals from your account or enter into an investment advisory contract

We also collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.

Why can't I limit all sharing?

Federal law gives you the right to limit only

- sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes—information about your creditworthiness
- affiliates from using your information to market to you
- sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you

State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing. See below for more on your rights under state law.

What happens when I limit sharing for an account I hold jointly with someone else?

Your choices will apply to everyone on your account—unless you tell us otherwise.

Definitions

Affiliates

Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *New Hampshire Mutual Bancorp;*
- *Merrimack County Savings Bank;*
- *Meredith Village Savings Bank;*
- *Savings Bank of Walpole; and*
- *The New Hampshire Trust Company*

Nonaffiliates

Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.

- *Merrimack County Savings Bank, Meredith Village Savings Bank, Savings Bank of Walpole and The New Hampshire Trust Company do not share with nonaffiliates so they can market to you.*

Joint marketing

A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.

- *Our joint marketing partners include credit and debit card companies, broker-dealer companies, insurance companies and brokers, and financial service companies.*

Other important information

You may have other privacy protections under some state laws. We will comply with applicable state laws as to information about you, including medical information.
